The following was written by Mel Dahl, RVC10. I asked and received permission to use it in this column. My only edit of his writing is the addition in brackets {}.

"Mensa has just completed the most extensive survey it has ever taken of its members to determine member satisfaction and ask people what they want out of Mensa. In February 2010, surveys were mailed to 10,000 members (or about 17% of our 58,000 members). 1,379 people (14% of those surveyed, 2.3% of our total membership) responded. Since the responses were self-selected by those who chose to return the survey it is not truly a random sample. Nevertheless, it is the largest survey taken of our membership to date. The results were published in the June 2011 Report of the Local Group Services & Funding Task Force, chaired by Robin Crawford. "The survey contained predictable questions: Why did you join Mensa, and what were you hoping to get out of it, and did you get out of it what you were hoping to get out of it. The answers were mostly what one would intuitively have expected even without taking a survey. Previous surveys had given us the wholly unsurprising information that the more actively one participates in Mensa activities, the more likely one is to be happy with one's Mensa membership, and also that the biggest worry for local group leaders is the lack of volunteers. And if that's all the information that this latest survey had given us I'd probably file it away instead of devoting a column to it.

"The thing that makes this survey particularly valuable, in my opinion, is the fact that every one of the 1,379 people who responded were given an open-ended question: What service(s) do you want from your local group that is not listed on this survey? And the recurring answer, over and over again, was: I live too far away from any activities; I wish I could get to local activities but they are an hour, two hours, three hours away from me.

"In other words, we have a significant chunk of members who would like to attend local group events (and we know from earlier surveys that participation in local group events leads to increased satisfaction with Mensa membership) but live far enough away from the centers of their local groups to make it feasible for them to do so. The key to their satisfaction with Mensa membership is to make it easier for them to attend local group events.

"In Florida {I ask you to substitute Region 3}, we have several local groups that are fairly tightly compacted and finding an event nearby should not be a problem. We also have other groups that are more spread out and, in looking at the calendars for those groups, I can see that someone living at one end of the local group area very well might not be able to conveniently attend anything offered by local groups.

"So, I am asking two things. First, if you are a locsec/member of a local excom, please look at your calendar to see if all areas of your local group have events and, if not, please try to find someone willing to organize one.

"Second, if you are a member who would like to attend local events but there is nothing near where you live, please consider organizing something yourself. I'm sure your local newsletter will be happy to give you space, and you can get email addresses for members in your area by going to the membership directory on our national Web site. If you need logistical assistance, talk to your locsec or talk to me. Let's see if we can broaden the areas that have local events."

Venue Review: Marge’s Lakeside Inn

We held our August *First Thirstday* event at Marge’s, on the lake in Irondequoit. I had never been but the group has gathered at Marge’s several times previously. As it turns out, Marge’s is a great place to get a cool drink, take advantage of a cool breeze, and enjoy the view. Indeed, the trip yielded a number of priceless and intriguing photos.

Marge’s serves no food but that creates no problem: Several burger and ice cream establishments line the street opposite Marge’s; Don’s Original is directly across. And apparently, as we found out, bringing in catered meals sometimes is allowed...

Two factors influenced our trip, one in the plus column, and one... not so much. Upon arriving, we learned that a rather large company gathering was being hosted. The result was that the outdoor beach area was bustling and the interior was downright crowded. We were able to secure sufficient tabletop real estate for our purposes, and the service at the bar was pretty snappy given the circumstances, but navigating through the narrow beach house to our sandy roost was a challenge.

The other element, the positive, was that the weather definitely was on our side. We were able to perch on a picnic table, grab a bite to eat, engage in our various conversations, put our toes in the sand, and dwell in the lakefront setting until well after the sun dipped below the horizon. Even with Irondequoit’s finest issuing citations due to some patrons’ limited ability to cope with limited parking accommodations (none of us were ticketed), I still would say the positives outweighed the negatives, making it a worthwhile trip. On a five-star scale, I would give Marge’s three and a half stars, and I rate the opportunity to spend some time with my RAM “family” a solid five.
