Well, that's an experience I hope I do not ever have to repeat! I wrote last month that I had attended the American Mensa Committee (AMC) meeting in Las Vegas the first weekend in December. That column was written a month earlier and that, most certainly, was my intention. However, at the last minute I had to cancel my trip. Not willing to leave Region 3 without a vote, I arranged to attend the meeting via a phone connection. I tried using the speakerphone, but was not able to hear very well, so nine hours of holding the phone to my ears except for two 15-minute breaks and an hour lunch break made for two very sore ears and one very tired RVC!

This was definitely not the way to be at a meeting! When it came time to vote, I raised my hand, but couldn't be seen. Then it was, "Betsy, how do you vote?" Had to "un-mute" to vote or to voice my opinion. There were presentations that I could hear, but not see. There were facial expressions that couldn't be seen. I know I missed out on the discussions held during lunch and the breaks. Other than the placement of my name placard next to the phone microphone, a cute picture of which was sent to me, the experience was just plain awful. Remember that anyone serving on the NomComm or anyone living at that same address cannot run for a national office. The NomComm will decide its role (the primary role will be to find members to run for office – Chair, 1st Vice Chair, 2nd Vice Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, and Regional Vice Chairs – but it may empower itself to pass judgment on those who seek NomComm endorsement) when it meets at the 2012 AG in Reno. NomComm members do NOT need to attend the AG. Looking forward to hearing from you soon!
