Testing begins promptly at 12:00 noon; candidates should plan to show up early. Two Mensa-approved IQ tests are administered, and passing either one will qualify the candidate for membership.

We will be attempting to contact all those who have expressed an interest in membership in early October. However, if you know of anyone interested, please have him or her contact us. The minimum age for any IQ test Mensa offers is 14 years. Again, prior registration and prepayment makes things a lot easier for everyone.

For those wishing to attend, the Irondequoit / Helen McGraw library is located just west of Wegmans on E. Ridge Road in Irondequoit, on the same side of the street. We plan to have a Mensa poster displayed on the on door – no yellow balloons this time (Oops, sorry! ☺) Don't forget that Mensa also recognizes some 200 or so standardized intelligence and IQ tests, so that may be an option for those who do not wish to participate in our October Testing Day.
