Because of an old custom, I could not help and no one else was making an effort to help, so we watched as this scenario carried on for far too long.

In an airport in another country, I saw a woman who was trying to avoid being sent back to the place she had just left; she was crying and fearful for her safety if sent back. We won't even get into the issues of clean drinking water or well-supplied restrooms. I guess that my overall impression is that for as many faults as our country has, it still attracts people from all over the world who would choose to reside here because of our standard of living! Remember to be thankful for all of the everyday things we take for granted!

Region 3 knows how to put on parties! I just returned from Dayton's annual picnic and what a great event it was. I've had the opportunity this summer to attend Southeast Michigan's and Cleveland's picnics and many other regional events. It's been a wonderful summer.

The National NomComm has completed its work and now is the time for those who wish to run for Chair, 1st Vice Chair, 2nd Vice Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, or Region 3 Vice Chair to do so by following American Mensa's petition process which is as follows:

"In accordance with Art. VI, Sec. (4) of the Bylaws of American Mensa, Ltd., nominations for candidacy for office in American Mensa may be made by petition. Each petition must contain the signatures of 50 members of American Mensa in good standing as of December 1, 2012. Petitions must be submitted on official petition forms. Each petition candidate must also submit a completed Acceptance of Nomination form and a completed Candidate Information Form.

Petition forms, Candidate Information Forms, and Acceptance of Nomination forms are available below and may also be obtained by contacting the National Office at [Operations@americanmensa.org](mailto:Operations@americanmensa.org). You also can start an online, members-only petition via the Web site. All petition candidates should review the 2013 Code of Election Procedures before beginning the petition process. Members wishing to sign available online petitions may do so via the same link.

Candidate petition forms must be received by 11:59 p.m. central time on February 1, 2013. Send completed forms and petitions to [Operations@americanmensa.org](mailto:Operations@americanmensa.org), fax to 817/649-5232, or mail to Elections, American Mensa, Ltd., 1229 Corporate Drive West, Arlington, Texas 76006-6103."
