We went to the Royal Ontario Museum and saw the gem exhibit. We saw many interesting things: There were huge waves of copper, blocks of diamond, bright yellow sulfur, deep purple sparkly amethyst, crystals of quartz, and most remarkable of all, a gem called a cerussite, rarer and more shiny than diamond, that was 898 carats. It's the largest cut stone of it's kind! In addition to gems, there was a dinosaur exhibit w/T Rex, pteranodons, and many of their friends.
